





ST PETER'S - OUTSTANDING SUPPORT

SETTLING IN

We have strong relationships with all our partner primary schools and work closely with them to support the children's transition to secondary school. Our Head of Year 7, Sarah Johnson, Senior Leader for Transition and Induction, manages the process.

KEEPING IN TOUCH

Parents and carers can view up-to-date information about their child's progress and achievements, as well as their timetable and the names of their teachers, online via a secure website. We encourage parents and carers to contact the school if they have any queries or concerns via email, phone or by writing a note in the student's diary, which the students carry with them during the day.

In the first term of Year 7 parents are invited to meet with their child's tutor to review the settling-in period. Later there is a Parent-Teacher evening so parents can discuss the progress of their child with all his or her teachers. Parents also receive information about progress in the form of reviews at intervals throughout the year and a full personalised report is issued for all students once a year.

PASTORAL CARE

The pastoral work of the school is a real strength. We focus on supporting students to achieve their very best by celebrating success, developing selfconfidence, fostering both academic resilience and mutual encouragement of peers and by allaying any anxieties and concerns. Students are placed in tutor groups, their care and welfare is the responsibility of Form Tutors, who co-ordinate with Year Leaders and other pastoral staff. Each tutor group meets once a day during tutorial time, which includes a corporate act of worship. The Form Tutor is usually the first point of contact between home and school.

St Peter's Chaplaincy is a ministry which serves to animate the spiritual and liturgical life of the School, support the pastoral system and promote the values of the Gospel. Its outreach extends to families, parishes, our two dioceses, local community and partner primary schools. Our own team is supported by local clergy and other religious groups.

Students feel well supported throughout their time at the school. The strong pastoral systems ensure that young people feel safe and have an adult to talk to when needed. The pastoral team take a pride in knowing each child well. Section 48 Inspection (March 2020



We focus on the positive behaviours that students need to enhance their learning. We recognise and celebrate their qualities of persistence, imagination, inquisitiveness, preparedness, collaboration and ambition. Relationships in the school are based on mutual respect. We value smartness, self-respect and safety for all. St Peter's is uncompromising, for example, about the importance of student appearance and adherence to the uniform code. We also operate a ban on mobile phones.





Our discipline systems are influenced by the Christian notion of forgiveness and reconciliation; however, school sanctions do exist to deter and correct undesirable behaviour. Sanctions include detentions, both after class and after school; periods of 'inclusion' from peers, temporary suspensions from school and permanent exclusions.

FACILITIES

We have wonderful accommodation, with excellent facilities surrounded by ample playing fields. In addition to the provision of a learning resource centre, science laboratories, technology facilities and workshops, art rooms and subject specialist rooms there is also a large sports hall with climbing wall, gym, 462 seat theatre, canteen, drama rooms, dance studio and a purposebuilt Chapel.

We are an all-through school which operates across two sites. As well as our extensive Secondary and Sixth Form site in Southbourne, we also have our Primary site at Iford. We sometimes bring the students together to share experiences and skills, for example our Sports Leaders teach a variety of sports at our primary school, it's a real pleasure to see our students of all levels learning from each other.

CAREERS EDUCATION

Careers education and guidance are provided in a variety of ways through curriculum time, opportunities for interviews and specific careers advice and online support. The Careers programme begins in Year 7 where students are encouraged to consider real life decision-making and evaluate their own strengths and areas for improvement.

EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

St Peter's runs several clubs and societies, at lunch and after school. Activities include rugby, soccer, hockey, netball, basketball, volleyball, cricket, athletics, tennis, chess and art and craft clubs. A health suite with cardiovascular and resistance equipment is available for the use of older students. A purpose-built Dance Studio provides for curricular and extra-curricular pursuits. A drama club, music groups and choirs provide live theatre and music at regular intervals.

We do not select our intake on the grounds of prior attainment or perceived ability. We believe that all students can thrive, learn together and sustain normal social relationships in a community that is inclusive. As a Catholic school we are more socially and ethnically diverse than most UK schools. We welcome every child into the school community whatever his or her ability, social background, or ethnic origin.

Students with Special Educational Needs are provided with appropriate support. We have teaching assistants


Inspectors were very impressed not just by pupils' attitudes towards learning but also with their behaviour in lessons and around the site. Pupils are unfailingly polite and courteous Ofsted and teachers specialising in English as an Additional Language, Language and Communication needs and literacy and numeracy support.

Students from St Peter's will advance to a wide range of degree courses, after completing our Sixth Form. St Peter's has a large and flourishing Sixth Form with approximately 350 students. Courses are predominantly for students wishing to study subjects to Level 3 (A Level or equivalent) in preparation for entry into higher education and specific vocational career paths.

The school has a development plan for improving access, but prospective Parents/Carers should be aware that the Southbourne site is built on a slope with multiple buildings and levels and currently not all specialist areas are wheel-chair accessible
