This is the basic unit and we need to understand all parts:

- Rights and responsibilities
- Power, politics and the media
- The global community

The focus is on underpinning the key concepts of citizenship:

1. rights and responsibilities
2. democracy and justice
3. identities and diversity

Students are encouraged to develop an interest in topical and controversial issues, and ethical considerations. Critical engagement is central to this unit as active learning enables students to achieve deeper understanding and appreciation of concepts.

Examined unit: Unit 3 "Citizenship in Context"

Study up to three key ideas, **choosing one to answer questions on in the exam.**

Units are –

A Environmental change and sustainable development

B Changing communities: social and cultural identities

C Influencing and changing decisions in society and government

Need to look at the units above from different perspectives: individual, community, national, global, political, social and ethical.

The purpose of Unit 3 is for students to demonstrate how they reconcile such differences, find reasons to accept some ideas and reject others, and then go on to reach conclusions. One aspect of this unit concerns the issue of presentation of representations and bias.

Students will be given support in the preparation of the work required during lesson time, but after school, lunchtime and Saturday rehearsals will also be available.

See as much live theatre or NT Live as possible. Any standard and any genre. Read into current theatre (Stage Newspaper / Twitter etc... to follow theatres and publications).

The course has 3 components

Component 1: Devising 40%

Students devise their own performance in groups for an audience from a stimulus. They will perform this with full technical and production elements in the Theatre. Accompanying this will be some written coursework which asks the students to discuss the devising process and the way that the devised piece developed over time. This can be in written format or via video.

Component 2: Performance from Text 20%

Students perform two 10 minute extracts from a published play with full technical and production elements to an invited examiner. They will be assessed on their acting skills (voice / movement / characterisation) and also their ability to communicate to an audience effectively as a group. Marks for this unit are entirely for practical performance and has no written component.

Component 3: Theatre Makers in Practice 40%

A written exam lasting 1 hr 30 minutes.

The students will write a theatre review after attending a live performance. They will also respond to a text by writing about how they would stage extracts as a designer, director and an actor. Work on this exam will include lots of practical activities that they then use to develop written responses to the question.

Over the first year students will be introduced to all key texts and will have opportunities for mocks in all 3 components. Students will work practically through the year and work as a director, designer and actor as well as visiting the theatre. This will then lead on to working on the components again starting in the Summer term of year 10 where they will begin working towards their GCSE grade.

Read the poems again and make notes on content, language, form and structure.

Make posters with key quotations about characters and themes in Macbeth, An Inspector Calls, A Christmas Carol and Jekyll and Hyde and the poetry.

Watch film versions of the texts.

Research aspects of context including information about the writers and the historical periods in which the texts were written/ set.

Read magazines, newspaper articles and other non-fiction texts – notice the different ways that the authors have used language.

Use BBC Bitesize

Make your own revision mats for each section of the examinations.

Learn key words by playing games and displaying them around the house.

Work with other students to question, revise and read the plays.
